Secondary Trauma – How to Reconcile Its Impact

Neurological Assessments

Developments continue in neurological assessments in the pre-hospital setting. 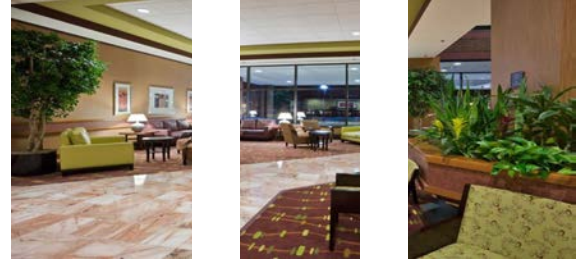

Plenary Keynote Session: Medical Response to the Active Shooter

The shootings at Columbine High School, Virginia Tech University and the events of 9-11 have required EMS agencies small and large to analyze their abilities to provide care in the tactical environment. This session will discuss many of the considerations while providing care in the hot zone, as well as discussing new treatment trends in tactical medicine. With the increased threat of active shooters in schools, this lecture will explore the profile of the active shooter, as well as current law enforcement tactics used to stop the active shooter. This lecture will also discuss various injury patterns, stages of care in tactical medicine, and treatments that are currently being tested in the battlefield of Iraq and Afghanistan. This session is designed for active emergency medical services instructors and providers. EMS instructors will gain insight into presenting this material in the EMS classroom to better prepare the EMS student for this area of EMS response.
